Water Use Quiz

NOTE: This activity should be done in conjunction with the Bible lesson, [Living in Bible Days](#).

Age Group Children in grades 3 – 6

Materials Parent or teacher should have copies of the quiz on the next page available for each child.

Activity Parent or teacher should explain how the quiz works; that each question has an answer in brackets, but the child shouldn't give that answer away too early. Each child can then take a copy of the quiz home and see how aware their parents or older siblings are about water facts in Canada and the developing world.

For each question, the child can reveal the correct answer after the parent or sibling has made their guess. Explain that questions four and five have choices of answers and the children should read those choices aloud and learn if their parents or siblings can guess the right choice.

Reflection The children can either keep their quizzes at home or bring the quizzes to class. The parent or teacher can ask children how their family did and if they were surprised at the results.

A quiz for your parents, or older brother or sister

- 1) **How many people die every day around the world after getting sick from bad water?**
(4,500)
- 2) **How many people in poor countries don't have access to safe water?** (1.1 billion)
- 3) **How many people in poor countries don't have toilets?** (2.6 billion)
- 4) **How many hours do all the people in Africa spend carrying water from rivers, lakes and wells to their homes?** (40 billion)
 - a) 100 million
 - b) 860 million
 - c) 25 billion
 - d) 40 billion
- 5) **How much water do most people in Canada use each day?** (329 liters)
 - a) 20 liters
 - b) 114 liters
 - c) 225 liters
 - d) 329 liters
- 6) **How much water do most people in poor countries use each day?** (20 liters)
