A LIFELINE FOR THE WEARY

 Anastasiya* and her friends were out for a walk in the neighborhood when suddenly the air raid began. “We were not able to hide. I was terrified,” she said. Shrapnel ricocheted around Anastasiya and pierced her leg. A wife and mother of five, her thoughts immediately turned to her family: *What would happen to them if she did not survive?*

The war in Ukraine has destroyed the healthcare infrastructure in many communities, including Anastasiya’s. She had to travel 16 hours to reach a medical facility that could operate on her leg—and even then, anesthesia and pain medication were not available to her during the excruciating procedure. Anastasiya remained in a rehab center for several months, and her leg still did not heal. She only saw her husband twice during that time since he needed to be home with their children. Feeling alone

and hopeless, she wondered if she would ever recover and enjoy a normal life with her family again. Generous donors made it possible for Samaritan’s Purse to deploy an Emergency Field Hospital near Anastasiya’s town in eastern Ukraine soon after the area was liberated. Our team performed a complex surgery on her leg that finally set her on a path toward healing. Samaritan’s Purse staff also prayed with Anastasiya and shared with her about God’s steadfast love.

Anastasiya is among more than **23,000 INDIVIDUALS** who received medical care from Samaritan’s Purse teams during the crisis in Ukraine. We thank God for nearly **700 STAFF—including more than 100 CANADIANS**—who deployed to that country to demonstrate Christ’s love to people in desperate need and to help relieve suffering. We deployed our first Emergency Field Hospital in Ukraine just a week after the conflict began. Our response soon expanded to include outpatient clinics, mobile medical teams, and ambulance transport services. Through **38 AIRLIFTS**—36 of which were with the Samaritan’s Purse DC-8 cargo jet—our teams helped transport hundreds of tons of relief items, including medical supplies, for hospitals throughout Ukraine. In addition to utilizing aircraft to transport critical medical supplies, **the Samaritan’s Purse DC-8 flew 267 UKRAINIAN REFUGEES from Poland to Toronto’s Pearson Airport**, where Samaritan’s Purse arranged for them to be reunited with family, friends, or sponsors across Canada. As Ukrainians fled to western parts of their country, our Disaster Assistance Response Team members began working with our network of more than **3,200 UKRAINIAN CHURCH PARTNERS to provide relief items, including 120 MILLION POUNDS OF FOOD and 30 MILLION LITERS OF CLEAN WATER.**

Helping Those Far From Home

As the conflict in Ukraine continued, more than 8 million Ukrainians—a majority of them women and children—escaped to the safety of other European countries. Samaritan's Purse responded to their needs by working with more than **90 CHRISTIAN PARTNERS** (many of them churches) in **17 NATIONS** to make sure these refugees had food, shelter, education, protection, and help to heal from the trauma of war.

Ana, one of those refugees, learned, laughed, and played with the other Ukrainian children at a small community center in Hungary. They built puzzles, sang songs, and enjoyed just being kids.

Then, the roar of jet engines and the clatter of helicopter blades sent the horrors of war flooding back. Terrified, Ana ran to her sister and held on tightly.

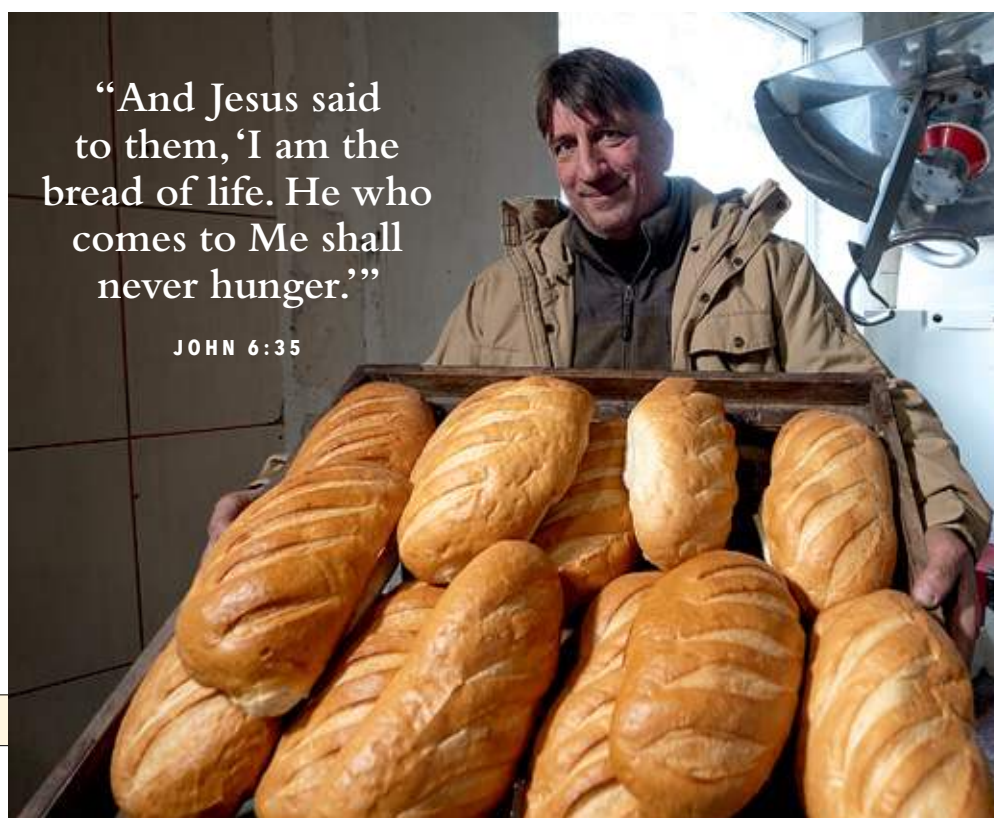
The aircraft were only part of a military drill, but it didn't matter to Ana. For a little girl who recently ran from war, the sounds reminded her of the worst.

As the noise faded, a team of Christian child development specialists—available because of Samaritan's Purse donors—gathered the children to talk through their fears and experiences and reassure them of God's love and care for them. Nearby, their moms did much the same.

"We will have to hold many personal sessions with [Ana] until the fear will be eventually removed from her heart," our Hungarian partner wrote.

More than **150,000 REFUGEES** have received help through this work in Europe.

Bringing Help, Hope To Pakistan Flood Victims

As millions of people struggled to recover from monsoons that flooded 30 percent of Pakistan in 2022, Samaritan's Purse provided life-saving emergency supplies with the support of generous Canadians.

We shipped four containers of supplies to Pakistan, including more than **5,000 KITCHEN SETS, 5,400 WATER FILTERS, and 10,000 PACKAGES** of dehydrated vegetable mix—which is the equivalent of 1 million meal servings.

“Even before flooding in Pakistan reached catastrophic levels, we were there providing aid,” said Jason Martens, food program manager for Samaritan's Purse Canada. “As the floodwaters rose, so did our response.”

The four containers were unloaded and distributed by our partners in Pakistan, who were invited by the government to provide emergency help.

“The need in Pakistan is enormous and urgent,” said Martens. “Alongside our local partners, we are continuing to provide critical help and share the hope of God's love.”

A WAY BACK FROM DISASTER

“**Y**ou guys showed up, literally, like a gift from God.” As chainsaws buzzed and an army of orange-shirt volunteers worked behind him, Percy was overcome by emotion. “I never could have done this on my own. It’s like a breath of fresh air.”



For more than two weeks, Percy had been trying to decide how to recover after Hurricane Fiona tore through Atlantic Canada and his Prince Edward Island home in September 2022. Dozens of fallen trees clogged his driveway, while others had crashed around his family home.

When Percy learned from his wife that Samaritan’s Purse was at nearby Cornerstone Baptist Church, the self-sufficient, hard-working boatmaker was initially reluctant to ask for help.

But upon arrival at our Disaster Relief Unit tractor trailer, “It was like a safe haven,” Percy said. “There was

this immediate, ‘We can help you.’ I’ve never experienced it before—totally unconditional.”

Prince Edward Island was among three disaster-hit areas where Canadian donors made it possible for Samaritan’s Purse to respond with help and hope in Jesus’ Name. Earlier in 2022, we cleaned up the flooded homes of **40 FAMILIES** in the Northwest Territories town of Hay River. And in June, our **VOLUNTEERS** cleaned up **113 STORM-DAMAGED PROPERTIES** in Ottawa, Ontario.

As our volunteers completed the work on Percy’s home—one of more

than **300 PROPERTIES** we worked on in Prince Edward Island—they had an opportunity to pray with him and share that the love he experienced was because of Jesus Christ. The Lord used that love to bring **40 PEOPLE TO FAITH IN HIS SON** in Prince Edward Island, Ottawa, and Hay River.

“Words alone cannot express how grateful we are,” Percy and his wife wrote in a note to the Hurricane Fiona team. “Thank you for the beautiful Bible. May God be with us all.” ■

THANKING GOD FOR 200 MILLION BLESSINGS

In 2022, we celebrated the 200 millionth Operation Christmas Child shoebox collected by Samaritan’s Purse since 1993. We praise God for the millions of children, as well as families and communities, who’ve been reached with the Gospel of Jesus Christ over nearly three decades.

Former shoebox recipient Elizabeth Groff took the symbolic **200 MILLIONTH SHOEBOX** to Ukraine, where she gave it to Natalya, an 8-year-old living in an orphanage. Natalya said her favorite gift in the shoebox was a yellow flashlight because it will guide her as she seeks cover in a dark basement during overnight air raids.

Like Natalya, Elizabeth also spent most of her childhood in an orphanage in Ukraine. She was 7 when she and her younger sister ran away because her father died and her grieving mother turned to alcohol.

Elizabeth’s shoebox gift reminded her that God had not forgotten her—and she prays that Natalya will also experience the Savior’s faithfulness and love.

“I pray that this child realizes that she isn’t alone,” Elizabeth said. “I want her to know the hope of Jesus.”

In 2022, **10.6 MILLION SHOEBOX GIFTS** were prayerfully packed for boys and girls all over the world by people from 11 countries. **Canadians packed more than 415,000 SHOEBOXES** physically and online at PackaBox.ca.

More than **4.3 MILLION SHOEBOX RECIPIENTS** participated in our voluntary follow-up discipleship program, The Greatest Journey, with **2.4 MILLION BOYS AND GIRLS** making decisions for Christ.

Among the children who received gift-filled shoeboxes was 8-year-old Hadiza* in Gambia. As she dug through the contents of her shoebox gift, Hadiza was drawn to school supplies she found and, uniquely, a tape measure, which she gave to her father to help him with his work.

Hadiza and her friends were so excited that they ran to show their teacher. As he heard them talk about their gifts and the love of Jesus they had heard about, he began to cry.

The girls also wanted to learn more about Jesus and accepted the invitation of the local Christians to attend The Greatest Journey. Hadiza participated in all 12 lessons and graduated with one of her friends, receiving a certificate and New Testament Bible in her language. The two are now regular members of a children’s ministry in their village.

We praise God for the tens of thousands of people in Canada and around the world who volunteer annually—many of them year-round—to support and promote Operation Christmas Child. They are vital to the success of this ministry. ■

Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene

"IF YOU COULD SEE THEIR HAPPY AND EXCITED FACES"

Janella's* heart breaks as she walks down narrow streets and past dilapidated homes. Her grief is for the residents of this desperately impoverished community in the southern Philippines. Trash-filled roads, stagnant puddles, and poor sanitation remind her of their daily struggle. "My heart cries," she said.

This place of struggle and sorrow is where God called Janella to work. She is a community health agent with our local partner and, being from the region, has a deep love for its people.

"This community is known as a slum area," she told us. "I am convinced of God's love for the people and want only that they too would have the privilege of knowing Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior." And God has been opening a door for Janella to share that message through safe water.

After completing her health agent training, Janella told a woman from the community about water filters. "She was so excited about this project that she proposed I share it with a group [of women] she organized," Janella said.

At that first meeting, she spoke from Matthew 22:37-39: "We shared that the reason we are meeting and sharing about the water project is obedience to what Jesus has taught on loving the Lord and loving our neighbor as ourselves.

"We want to share this love with them through the water filter that will provide them clean water for good

hygiene and sanitation for their whole family, as well as their community," Janella said.

Thirty women, including Aileeza,* eagerly requested water filters and hygiene training and began meeting with Janella once a week.

Work and income have been unreliable for Aileeza's family of six, especially during the pandemic. On top of that, they have battled illness from dirty, dangerous water.

"Our water comes from the faucet, and the faucet [and water that comes from it] is dirty—as if it has bacteria," Aileeza said. "We get headaches, stomachaches, and the children get worms." Parasitic worms are common in contaminated water.

Since receiving their filter, life has changed for Aileeza and her family. "When we drink the filtered water, the pain in our stomach disappears," she said. "It helps clean our bodies because we are drinking clean water."

The Philippines is just one country where partners like you made it possible to install

6,687 HOUSEHOLD WATER FILTERS and **32 SCHOOL/COMMUNITY FILTERS** in 2022. We also constructed over **700 HANDWASHING STATIONS** and nearly **1,000 LATRINES**.

The help Canadians provided means that people like Aileeza also no longer spend what little money they have on medicine to combat waterborne illnesses.

As Janella continues walking with Aileeza and others in the Philippines, she rejoices in the life-changing impact of the water filters and hygiene training.

"If you could see their happy and excited faces," she said. But even more, she praises God for His work in their hearts. "The water we offer to our friends is not just clean water but the water of eternal life that Jesus offered," Janella said. "It is the water that will transform them and their whole community into a new creation in Jesus Christ." ■

FREED FROM EXPLOITATION

Seventeen years in prostitution left Makenna* unspeakably lonely and ashamed.

At 12 years old, Makenna's aunt brought her to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia's capital, to be a housemaid. For a time, the arrangement worked—until Makenna was no longer wanted and made to serve without pay.

Desperate and forced to fend for herself, Makenna sought the help of a job broker, who led her to a brothel and nearly two decades of sexual slavery.

Then, she learned about a Samaritan's Purse partner that could help her escape. Makenna ran to them and never looked back.

With our partner, Makenna found help to heal physically, emotionally, and spiritually. She received safe housing, Biblical counseling, and help to care for her daughter, who was born while Makenna was trapped in prostitution.

Makenna joined other women in learning new job skills such as hairdressing, tailoring, and catering.

Best of all, Makenna was surrounded by the love of Christ.

"Jesus' love enabled Makenna to forgive herself," our partner shared. Makenna is now living in victory, "I am loved, and I am a free woman," she said.

In 2022, the prayers and support of generous Canadians enabled our teams and partners to support women at risk in countries including Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, Cambodia, India, and Costa Rica. In total, we helped **MORE THAN 1,500 WOMEN** find safe housing.

HOPE FOR REFUGEE FAMILIES

Weighing less than an average 6-month-old, 2-year-old Aliyah* was struggling. Her precious life was slowly draining away from a lack of calcium, iron, and other nutrients.

Aliyah's mother—a Syrian refugee—was distraught. The sprawling city of Cairo, Egypt, where she had fled, offered shelter from conflict and poverty in her homeland, but little else.

Millions of refugees like Aliyah and her mom live in Egypt. They come from Syria, South Sudan, Ethiopia, and other conflict-torn nations. They often arrive traumatized and feeling lost.

But when they walk through the door of our partner's life-giving medical clinic, they discover “a spring of water in the wilderness” (Genesis 16:7).

At the clinic, refugees meet nurses, doctors, a psychologist, and others who look after them in obedience to Christ's call to welcome the stranger and share His Good News.

“We aim to show refugees their value, dignity, and worth as image-bearers of God who created them,” said our local partner.

The staff helped revive Aliyah. After three months of treatment and follow-up, she was walking, running, and tumbling like any other healthy toddler. Meanwhile, her mom made great progress at counseling sessions and was equipped with tools to care for her daughter, including a meal plan.

Aliyah and her mom are just two of thousands of women and children who received care at the clinic in 2022.

OVERCOMING HUNGER IN JESUS' NAME

Little patches of green dot the landscape around Akin's* home. They are a welcome relief for a hard-working farmer.

For months, it was almost impossible to grow anything here in southwestern Niger, on the edge of the Sahara desert. The rains didn't come as they should, and the sand was closing in.

“Our lands are deteriorating,” Akin said. “The fields are being overtaken by dunes. Our crops fed us for at most two months. Afterward, we experienced famine. Many of our children were becoming malnourished.”

But that was before a Samaritan's Purse team brought seeds, tools, and advanced agriculture training that empowered Akin to reinvigorate his failing crops.

Now, tiny moringa trees and millet and cowpea plants are pushing through the dry and dusty soil all around the area—little patches of green bringing life in the desert.

With these hardy and nutrient-packed crops, Akin can feed his once-hungry family year-round.

And using the new farming techniques he learned, he even got his land to produce plentiful food during drought. Our team also taught him and his wife how to prepare this food to maximize nutrition.

“Certainly, there is still work to be done, but thanks be to God,” Akin said, “today, we take care of ourselves and are able to help those who do not have the means to do the same.”

“We have been able to increase our agricultural yields through the training courses and seeds distributed by the project. We are able to get through the lean period. Our diets have improved a lot. Today, it is difficult to find a malnourished child in the village.”

Because of prayer and support like yours, Akin knows this life-saving help came in Jesus' Name. “Christians have shown us the true love of Jesus,” Akin said. “We are thankful that they came to teach us and share their knowledge

about Jesus with us. There is no greater love than that.”

Akin lives in a land where less than one percent of the population are believers. He does not yet know the Lord as Savior. But through this project, he has taken a step toward Him. We praise God for that.

As the hunger crisis grows around the world, Samaritan's Purse has been able to provide agricultural supports, livestock projects, and emergency food distributions. In 2022, we provided more than **85,000 PEOPLE WITH EMERGENCY FOOD** and distributed **LIVESTOCK, SEEDS, TOOLS, AND OTHER SUPPORT TO NEARLY 20,000 PEOPLE**.

World Medical Mission

BRINGING THE HOPE OF ETERNAL LIFE

Lydia* was struggling to breathe when she arrived at Chogoria, a World Medical Mission partner hospital in Kenya. She had accidentally ingested a poisonous insecticide. Dr. Paul Opare-Addo was on call that night and summoned to the hospital. The family medicine physician had treated various health issues since coming to Chogoria through World Medical Mission's Post-Residency Program, but Lydia's situation presented a new challenge.

Not knowing how much poison Lydia had taken, or how serious her condition was, he contacted Poison Control in the United States for advice. He and his colleagues then intubated Lydia and gave her a central line to receive medication.

A ventilator kept Lydia breathing for several days, while medicine injected into her bloodstream helped her body combat the effects from the toxins. Hospital staff and chaplains prayed for her continually.

Finally, she regained consciousness, only to begin a new battle against delirium. Once Lydia stabilized, she spent time with the hospital chaplains who shared the Gospel with her. With a grateful heart, Lydia surrendered her life to Christ and accepted Him as her Lord and Savior.

God used Dr. Opare-Addo and the team to provide Lydia with physical

and spiritual healing. Lydia's recovery brought a renewed hope and joy to Dr. Opare-Addo and the staff after they had witnessed a number of deaths in the ICU.

"Stories like Lydia's are a reminder of the salvation story—we were all dead, and Christ came to restore us," he said. "Medicine is a great avenue to show humanity God's restorative power."

In Kenya, Canadian pediatric surgeon Dr. John Fitzwater was doing his best to save a dying young boy. Confined to his hospital bed fighting a battle with terminal illness, there was nothing that could be done to save him.

As reality set in, all he could do was pray over the boy and his family.

The next morning, Dr. Fitzwater opened the chart again, finding a note inside that had been missing the night before. It was from a hospital chaplain who said the boy had prayed with him

to receive Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior after Dr. Fitzwater's visit.

Joy filled Dr. Fitzwater's heart, knowing that regardless of this boy's physical struggle, he would have eternal life. "I looked at him and said, 'You're now my brother,'" Dr. Fitzwater recalled, tears forming in his eyes.

"The smile on his face told me that he had genuinely followed Christ, and that's why we do what we do. We don't necessarily do it for the medicine, we do it to see people become members of the Kingdom and followers of Christ."

That's the ultimate goal of World Medical Mission as we support **DOZENS OF MISSION HOSPITALS** in developing nations. In 2022, we sent **640 HEALTHCARE VOLUNTEERS—32 FROM CANADA**—on short-term trips to **44 HOSPITALS**. ■

Supporting Persecuted Christians

THEY FEARED FOR THEIR LIVES

A teacher innocently walking down a dust-red road was the first victim gunned down that May morning. The attackers then moved toward a nearby church in a village in northwestern Niger. Militants vandalized walls, burned hymnbooks and vestments, and turned their guns on churchgoers.

These attacks, targeting Christians, left at least five people dead, some of the victims murdered within sight of their families.

In 2022, more than 300 people in the region were killed in such attacks. It is estimated that more than 10,000 people fled over two days from western Niger.

Samaritan’s Purse helped Christians fleeing this violence and arriving in the capital city. Salou,* a 21-year-old man from a village in western Niger, said these attacks are nothing new to the area and expects them to continue. “There were three attacks nearby before the attack that took place in our village. When the terrorists arrived, they attacked our church,” Salou said.

Our teams worked with local churches to distribute food, water, cooking supplies, hygiene kits, and other essentials as families sought refuge. We also served alongside Christians like Pastor Daniel and his congregation to help them show God’s love for their communities, especially women and children at risk.

“Living in a country where less than one percent of the population are Christians is difficult. It’s really not easy, you have to be a devout Christian, and you need a lot of support, a lot of prayers,” Pastor Daniel said.

“Samaritan’s Purse has helped us, especially since they have the same vision as us. We want to show God’s love in everything we do. We are

helping women who have never had access to land. We are helping them to have land ... and to be able to enroll their children in school.”

We praise God for opening doors to **SHARE CHRIST’S LOVE WITH MORE THAN 22,000 PEOPLE** through this work in Niger last year. ■

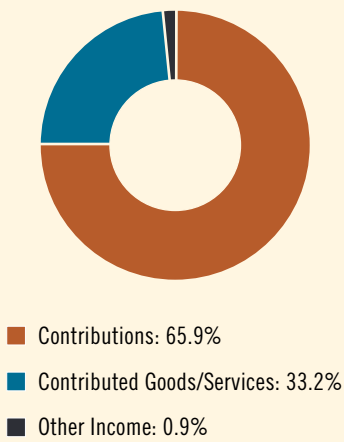

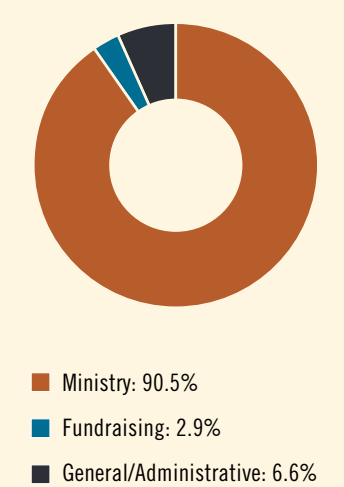
