Samaritan's Purse delivers these shoebox gifts and the Gospel booklet that accompanies each gift in partnership with local churches and ministries in more than 100 countries each year. We train these local volunteers to share the Gospel in a child-friendly way during community outreach events. Many of the shoebox recipients participate in our follow-up discipleship program called The Greatest Journey. Through the 12-lesson Bible-based course, millions of boys and girls have decided to follow Christ.

Doors Opening for Gospel

Romario grew up in the Saramaccan village of Duatra, deep in the jungle of Suriname.

The Saramaccans are descendants of African slaves who escaped and formed their own culture and language—a mix of African dialects, Portuguese, English, and Dutch.

Today, many still practice traditional animistic religion through rituals and rules. They cast spells and regularly go to small shrines where they call on the spirits of snakes, trees, or monkeys to help them.

As a child, Romario knew nothing about Jesus Christ, and there was no church to visit. Yet, he thought that there must be a God who made everything.

"I always had a hungry heart, looking for something special," he said. "I knew there was something missing in my life."

As a teen, Romario moved closer to the country's capital. He started attending a church, led by Pastor John Amoida, and Romario accepted Christ there.

Now, as a young adult, Romario's prayer is for his family, friends, and entire village to come to saving faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Both Romario and Pastor John are Saramaccans. Pastor John also serves as Suriname's Operation Christmas Child church mobilization coordinator.

"The shoeboxes are an open door for us to spread the Gospel," Pastor John said.

The Greatest Journey

The Greatest Journey, the follow-up discipleship program Samaritan's Purse developed for shoebox recipients, teaches children to follow Christ and tell others about Him.

Taught by trained local volunteers, the course equips students to follow Christ for a lifetime. Graduates receive a certificate and their own copy of God's Word in their language. For many children and their families, this is their first Bible.

As the boys and girls share their faith with family and friends, communities are transformed, and the influence of a simple shoebox gift multiplies.

Sending the Gospel to the Ends of the Earth

Ogouleroun was once his village's shaman, a position that family members had for five generations in the western African nation of Benin. But when a pastor held an Operation Christmas child outreach event in the village in 2021, dozens of children heard the Gospel, including Ogouleroun's grandchildren.

Ogouleroun then encouraged The Greatest Journey classes that took place just weeks after the outreach. When the village chief offered to provide a field for building the first evangelical church in hundreds of square miles, Ogouleroun began attending and trusted Jesus Christ as his Savior.

Taking the Gospel to the ends of the earth can mean going to hard-to-reach places where the Name of Jesus isn't known. Common barriers include strict customs regulations and often significant religious restrictions, sometimes requiring specially packed shoeboxes through Pack a Shoebox Online. Shoebox gifts packed online have been delivered to over 25 hard-to-reach countries.

Samaritan's Purse plans to deliver shoebox gifts to children in


