


The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.



Slide 2

- Operation Christmas Child is the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, sending millions of gift-filled shoeboxes across the globe each year.
- OCC demonstrates God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world.
- Together with the local church worldwide, each shoebox gift is an opportunity to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.





- Operation Christmas Child is the largest project of Samaritan's Purse.
- Samaritan's Purse is a nondenominational Christian organization providing spiritual and physical aid to victims of war, natural disasters, disease, famine, poverty and persecution in more than 100 countries. Samaritan's Purse is led by President and CEO Franklin Graham.
- You can see a snapshot of other programs and impact of Samaritan's Purse on this slide.


- So, you may wonder, why a shoebox gift?
- It all stems from Jesus's command in Matthew 28:19-20, or what we refer to as the Great Commission.
- Read verses
- Operation Christmas Child uses a shoebox gift as a tool to open the door for the Gospel and make disciples of all nations.
- As it says in Proverbs 18:16 "A gift opens the way for the giver and ushers him into the presence of the great." (NIV)
- God takes the simple gift and multiplies it in a way only He can, for tremendous Kingdom impact.
- I'm excited to share with you today how these gifts are changing the eternal destinies of millions of children and their families each year.





Slide Time: 2 minutes

- Operation Christmas Child starts right here with you!
- First, more than 500 year-round volunteers in Canada share about Operation Christmas Child and invite people to be involved.
- Individuals, families, groups and churches collect items throughout the year to fill shoebox gifts.
- Then, we pack our shoeboxes with toys, school supplies, hygiene items, letters/photos and most importantly, prayer.
- Next, during National Collection Week, the third week of November, we deliver our shoebox gifts to a Central Drop-off or Drop-off location near us. Last year there were more than 300 Drop-off Locations across Canada!
- Our shoeboxes are then transported to the Processing Center in Calgary, Alberta, where they are prepared for international shipping.
- Shoeboxes then make the long journey to their destination country. Gifts travel to more than 100 countries and territories each year, including hard-to-reach countries that are not named for security reasons.
- Shoeboxes are transported by various means, including boats, airplane and trucks. Once in country, they are sometimes transported by camel, yaks or even elephants!
- Finally, through the partnership of National Leadership Teams, Ministry Partners are equipped to share the Gospel in a child-friendly way and place our shoeboxes in the hands of precious children.


- How have you been involved with Operation Christmas Child?

- Through you, God truly is multiplying Good News and great joy!






- Operation Christmas Child has had an incredible global impact!
- Operation Christmas Child has been collecting gift-filled shoeboxes since 1993.
- 14 countries collected shoebox gifts last year, including the U.S., Canada, United Kingdom, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Spain, Finland, Australia, New Zealand, and South Korea.
- In these years, more than 209 million shoeboxes have been received and distributed to over 170 countries and territories!
- For many of the children receiving these shoeboxes, this is the first gift they have ever received. This opens their heart to God's love and the Gospel. Because these children share the message that they've received, each shoebox gift has the potential to impact as many as 10 people with the message of hope and redemption.

- Operation Christmas Child is all about **Evangelism**, **Discipleship** and **Multiplication**!
- Children and their families and friends are being introduced to Jesus.
- They are then being discipled to become disciple makers!
- As a result, the Gospel is being multiplied and the church worldwide is strengthened!
- First, Operation Christmas Child is focused on **evangelism** and reaching children with the message of the Gospel. In fact, we will often call shoeboxes GO Boxes –for G-Gospel O-Opportunity!

The Gospel is Shared! 79,000+ Outreach Events Each Year

- When locally trained Ministry Partners gather children together for a shoebox outreach event, the first priority is Evangelism and sharing the Gospel.
- The Gospel is presented in a child-friendly way with colorful pictures, tracing creation to the cross.
- Children are invited to receive Jesus, and are led through a simple prayer of commitment.
- And that is BEFORE shoeboxes are ever passed out!
- Then, boys and girls receive a surprise a shoebox gift that is a tangible expression of the love of God that they have just heard about for many their first gift ever.
- More than 79,000 shoebox outreach events happen around the globe in over 100 countries every year.





- When a shoebox gift is placed in the hands of the child God has chosen, Ministry Partners put a booklet called The Greatest Gift on top of the shoebox. (Show The Greatest Gift booklet)
- The Greatest Gift walks a child through the Gospel again, and is a book they can take home and share with their family and friends.
- The Greatest Gift is printed in 88 languages, with more translations in progress.
- This beautiful, colorful booklet is often poured over by the children, and reinforces that they are loved by God, and He has a plan for their life.
- The Greatest Gift showcases The Greatest Gift of All: Jesus!





- After a child hears the Gospel and receives their shoebox gift, which is **Evangelism**, Operation Christmas Child focuses on **Discipleship**, teaching children how to know Christ and grow in their faith.
- The Greatest Journey is the follow-up program to the shoebox outreach event. It is one of the largest discipleship programs
 in the world.
- After receiving shoebox gifts many children are invited to come back and participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program.
- Show TGJ Student Guide
- The Greatest Journey is a 12-lesson Bible study that teaches students how to follow Christ and share Him with others. They learn Bible stories, memorize verses and participate in activities. Six lessons are on coming to know Christ, 3 on growing in faith and 3 on sharing their faith with others.
- This is the 14th year of The Greatest Journey. More than 40.5 million children around the world have enrolled in this discipleship program!
- The Greatest Journey is also raising up a multitude of ministry leaders who are trained to share the Gospel and disciple children.
- Most of the churches we partner with have never received formal training on how to disciple children, nor have they ever had children's materials until Operation Christmas Child.
- Through OCC training with The Greatest Journey, teachers are equipped to apply Bible stories to students' lives and encourage students to retell the stories to others. (show TGJ Leader Guide)
- The Greatest Journey Leader Guide, as well as the teacher training, allows for low-literacy cultures to participate. This equips teachers to continue discipleship lessons with their students long after they complete the workbook.
- So far, 1.9 million teachers in more than 100 countries have been trained by Samaritan's Purse to lead The Greatest Journey, and make disciples! The numbers of trained disciple-makers continues to grow.





- After completing The Greatest Journey, children attend a graduation celebration and receive a certificate and a New Testament Bible in their own language.
- Some National Leadership Teams purchase caps and gowns to share across their country to celebrate this accomplishment. This may be the only graduation a child ever experiences.
- Family and friends who attend the ceremony hear the Gospel presented at the graduation of their loved one, reinforcing the changes they have seen in the student's lives.
- Families often come to faith in Christ as a result.
- In many cases the Bible the child receives is the first copy of God's Word to enter the household, and children read through their Bible again and again.
- The Greatest Journey Discipleship Program is reaping a tremendous harvest across the globe!
- 28.5 million children have graduated from The Greatest Journey in the last 14 years, and more than 20.3 million children have made decisions to follow Christ!

- Evangelism and Discipleship through shoebox outreach events and The Greatest Journey lead to the Multiplication of the Gospel. Children are becoming disciples and disciple makers. Churches are being planted, and unreached people groups are being reached with the Good News of Jesus!
- Multiplication starts with one simple shoebox gift, and the far-reaching impact is amazing!
- Operation Christmas Child has developed a purposeful strategy that utilizes evangelism and discipleship to reach more than just the shoebox recipient.
- Children share with their friends and family, and as the Gospel is multiplied, the church worldwide is growing and reaching even more people for Christ!
- As the Gospel is multiplied, teachers are trained and children come to know Jesus, local churches are being planted, strengthened and multiplied.
- Shoebox gifts open doors in communities without a church.
- As outreach events are hosted, children received shoebox gifts and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- The Greatest Journey discipleship program is offered to show children how to know Christ and share Him with others.
- As a result, children are leading their families to faith in Christ and new churches are born.
- Hundreds of new churches are being planted each year around the world as an outgrowth of Operation Christmas Child! Praise God!





Slide 14

- Another priority of Samaritan's Purse is sharing the Good News where it has never been heard.
- OCC is reaching the unreached through bringing shoebox gifts and the message of the Gospel to more than 100 ethnic groups whose population is less than 2 percent Christian. OCC's goal is to share the Gospel with 250+ unreached people groups by 2024.
- One example of this is the Himba people in Namibia, where this picture on the slide was taken. Samaritan's Purse partnered with the **Seed Company**, an affiliate of Wycliffe Bible Translators, to translate more than 80 Bible stories, including the entire Gospel of Mark, as well as The Greatest Journey.
- Since the Himba have a predominantly oral culture, these stories were distributed on 170 solar-powered MP3 players. Nearly 50 of the Himba shoebox recipients completed the 12 lessons of The Greatest Journey and, now, there are more than 80 believers among this unreached people group!


Reaching the Unreached!

- Another exciting way we are reaching the corners of the earth is through the Pacific Islands Initiative. OCC plans to deliver gift-filled shoeboxes to boys and girls on 1,000 Pacific islands over the next few years. Going island to island with the Gospel, we will work to introduce children to Jesus Christ.
- We plan to share the love of Christ with more than 500,000 children in the Pacific islands by 2023!
- On average, 1,000 churches are planted each year through the ministry of Operation Christmas Child.
- In 2023, over 182 previously unreached people groups were engaged with with gospel!





- Every minute on average...
- 20 children hear the Gospel every minute.
- Six children accept Jesus every minute that's one child deciding to follow Jesus every 10 seconds!
- So, during our time together today for this hour, on average 331 children made decisions for Christ, 416 graduated from The Greatest Journey and 1,209 children heard the Gospel at a shoebox outreach event.
- God is using this ministry in powerful ways!

- The statistics we just went over show how effective Operation Christmas Child is evangelism, discipleship and multiplication!
- We read in Matthew 14 about Jesus' return: "And this Gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come."
- By participating in Operation Christmas Child, can you believe that we get to be a significant part of ushering the return of Jesus!









- The third way you can join in what God is doing around the world through Operation Christmas Child is by partnering as a year-round volunteer.

- Becoming a year-round volunteer, and joining over 500 other Connect Volunteers in Canada, is an exciting way to fulfill God's purpose for your life and answer His Great Commission calling!








- This is what the structure of an OCC Area Team looks like.
- Area Coordinators build and lead a team of Ministry Coordinators.
- These Ministry Coordinators build and lead teams of volunteers Area Team Members who mobilize shoeboxes through prayer, promotion in churches, community groups and student groups, as well as through a healthy logistics network.





- This is another picture of a fully-functioning and effective Area Team.
- This shows the strength an Area Team has together, with our roots deep in Christ, as Colossians 2:7 says, "Let your roots grow down deep into Him, and let your lives be built on Him. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth..."
- You can see that this growth chart shows the function of a Coordinator as a Team Builder. Again, OCC Leader Volunteers build and lead teams of people (Area Coordinators and Ministry Coordinators who are Team Builders) who build and lead teams of people (Team Members) who mobilize shoeboxes through prayer, promotion and a healthy logistics network. These Team Members are the vibrant expression of activated ministry that is powerful and effective. They reach children around the nations by building relationships with Project Leaders and individuals who pack shoeboxes!
- As the Area Team grows, the branches reach out further and further, as shoebox gifts reach children to the ends of the earth with the Gospel and God's love.

- As a part of the Area Team, you will mobilize people and multiply shoebox gifts.
- It is a blessing to have such a vital role in what the Lord is doing here and overseas.
- We can be missionaries at home in our communities, and have an incredible impact in reaching children all over the world with God's love through Operation Christmas Child.





- Every single shoebox packed makes a difference!
- Here is just one of the millions of testimonies from around the world:
- Nahimana lives in Burundi, and he admits he wasn't a good father. In his words, "I didn't deserve to be called a father because I was frequently drunk. My wife and my children slept hungry many times." Sadly, they didn't have proper clothing.
- One day Nahimana's son came home with a shoebox gift and a small booklet called The Greatest Gift.
- Unbeknownst to his family, Nahimana began to read The Greatest Gift in secret, and wondered what it was all about. His son started The Greatest Journey discipleship program, and came home and told his parents what he was learning about Jesus. He graduated and brought his new Bible home.
- Nahimana then began reading this Bible, and God opened His heart. This broken father received Christ! As his wife saw the transformation in his life, she joined her husband in trusting in Jesus. The entire family became Christians and are now serving the Lord!
- What a wonderful example of how a life and a family can be changed by one single shoebox gift! Every shoebox matters, because every child and every family matters to God.
